Richard Castro Community Service Scholarship Application 2019

The Richard Castro Community Service Scholarship was initiated by CommUNITY en Accion (CEA), a non-profit organization of Hispanic business leaders founded by Richard Castro, a highly successful and well-known businessman who lives in El Paso, Texas. Mr. Castro has earned an admirable record of philanthropy and community service and has devoted much of his life and significant resources to creating opportunities for students to succeed, particularly those challenged by barriers to education.

The Richard Castro Community Service Scholarship is designed to reward eligible high school seniors who make significant community service contributions to their community. Students who participate in community service activities related to their future career goals are, in reality, jumping ahead of the competition and furthering their college-planning process by gaining real-world experience and giving back. Studies show that volunteering enhances a student's skill-set and helps prepare them for work experience. When students perform community service, they are often exposed to a variety of new experiences by the people, the environments and the duties they perform. Exposure to new people and different situations can help shape the direction of a young person's life and the way they view the world while instilling a sense of purpose and direction, as well.

RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

Scholarship Eligibility

To be eligible for the Richard Castro Community Service Scholarship, a student must:

- Have been enrolled the final two years of his/her education at one of the following school districts: Fabens ISD, Tornillo ISD, San Elizario ISD or Anthony ISD; and
- Must have a proven, strong commitment to community service and volunteerism (must show proof of service with a letter from the agency(ies) served, stating the work performed and number of hours served. To be eligible, candidates would have to perform a minimum of 200 hours of community service or volunteer hours per year for at least two years in high school; and
- Have a 2.5 or better cumulative GPA; and
- Meet all graduation requirements by June of their graduation year, as specified by the school district attended: Fabens, Tornillo, San Elizario or Anthony School District, and as set forth by the State of Texas (e.g., credits, EOC, state tests, etc.); and
- Have been accepted for enrollment to the University of Texas at El Paso, El Paso Community College or any accredited institution of learning or trade school within El Paso County; and
- Must be enrolled full-time in such institution of learning or trade school and show proof of enrollment.

Additional Requirements

- Approved one-time scholarships will be awarded a maximum of \$1,000 per student.
- Scholarships will be payable to the college, university or trade school after proof of registration is provided.
- Scholarships cannot be deferred.

Required Submissions

- Complete and upload or deliver application packet; and
- Upload letters proving community service performed and hours served; and
- Upload two letters of recommendation, dated and signed: Each should be a one-page letter of recommendation from a person in authority, such as high school administrator, faculty, staff, community member, employer or civic leader who is familiar with your abilities, work habits, integrity and potential (letters may not be from family or household members); and
- Upload unofficial high school transcript as of January 2019.

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Complete application MUST be submitted by 5 p.m. on April 12, 2019.
